<p>English Ms S Lowe</p>	<p>Support your children's reading and encourage quizzing. Take time to look at many different types of writing and poetry and what makes them different to one another. Help them to learn their spellings on www.spellzone.com. Support the correct punctuation in all of their writing and encourage cursive handwriting and pride in their work.</p>
<p>Mathematics Ms B Forth</p>	<p>Multiplication and division tables off by heart. Take any opportunity for mental maths e.g. money and change, time telling, estimating and counting. Encourage taking times table challenges. Try www.mathszone.co.uk or www.mathsplayground.co.uk Be aware Abacus Mathematics Learning Platform that will be accessed from home as term goes on. Please do not show your child different methods of column calculations that we have not taught in class, especially for numbers they can do mentally. Watch method videos on Abacus.</p>
<p>French Mme J Tourigny</p>	<p>Pupils will extend their descriptive abilities and talk about their favourite foods and learn to ask for snacks in French. They will also learn to give opinions on food. The term will end with a look at French festivals, months of the year and dates. Encourage your child to learn new vocabulary thoroughly when this is set as a homework task, with an emphasis on spelling. Please encourage them to sing the French songs they have learnt and bring in to school anything of interest about France.</p>
<p>Sciences Mrs J Byrne Mr M Phillips</p>	<p>Science: Please take your child on nature walks and discuss life cycles of plants and animals. Look around the house and discuss why objects are made of certain materials and what properties these materials have. Computing: Your child can practice their programming skills at home by using the online programs used in class like Scratch and Purple Mash '2Code.'</p>
<p>Humanities Mrs A Yates Mrs S Stapleton Mr J Thackway</p>	<p>History: Share books on the Egyptians and visit museums RE: Be prepared to discuss religious practices and what it means to believe something as well as why rules are needed. Geography: We will learn about the physical geography of the coastline, so discussion of holidays and seaside trips would help. In the second half of term the children will undertake a research project into a European country, possibly one the children have visited with their families.</p>
<p>Performing & Creative Arts Mrs J Barnes Miss K Thomson Mrs J Byrne</p>	<p>Music: Encourage listening to a wide range of music. Try to comment on it e.g. what instruments could you hear; was it fast or slow, what mood was it in? Speech and Drama: Please encourage your child to practise their poems and please listen to their performance, help them improve their Speech from the feedback comments that have been given in their books. Art & Design: Please encourage any drawing, painting and craft activities. Still life drawing and knowing different types of bags will be helpful.</p>

Dribbling skills including reverse stick can also be practised. Football: Practise passing, shooting and controlling the ball with both feet and different parts of the body Netball: Practise throwing and catching skills and shooting skills if possible. Swimming: Improve your child's stamina in the water by going for family swims. They can work on the technique that they have been working on in lessons as well.</p>
