English Ms Clark	Please support your children's reading and encourage regular quizzing. Find opportunities to look at a range of writing and poetry and what makes them different to one another, with a particular focus on fictional writing, persuasive texts and syllabic poetry. Help them to learn their spellings over the week, which are posted on Seesaw each Tuesday. Support the correct use of punctuation and high-level vocabulary in all their writing and encourage cursive handwriting and pride in their work. This term, the children can choose from a range of activities from an English homework grid, which will be posted on Seesaw. A completed activity should be handed in each Monday.
Maths Ms Clark	Encourage your children to learn their multiplication and division tables off by heart. Take any opportunity for mental maths e.g., money and change, time telling, estimating and counting. Encourage taking times table challenges on TT Rockstars and explore <u>www.mathszone.co.uk</u> or <u>www.topmarks.co.uk</u> . This term, maths homework will be set on Friday and is due in on Monday; it will usually be set on SeeSaw and should be completed in their homework books. Please avoid showing your child different methods to those taught in class – if in doubt, do feel free to ask.
PSHE Ms Clark	We will be discussing setting targets for ourselves; making plans and having goals; dealing with disappointment; resilience and having a positive attitude. We will also follow a unit of study addressing mental and physical health as we grow and change.
French Mrs Day	Ask your child to teach you French words! Our topics this term include clothes and colours. We will also study café drinks and snacks and fruit and vegetables. Pupils can use the Language Angels website in order to practise many of the topics we study. Science Mrs Johnson	Science: Use everyday opportunities to discuss sound, how it travels and how volume and pitch can be changed. Ask your child to think about everyday objects that use both light and sound to work. Talk to your child about the function and hygiene of teeth and how they are an important part of the digestion system. Science homework is set on a Thursday and is due in on a Friday.
Computing Mr Adkins	Computing: This term we will be moving on to explore language-based programming using Logo Turtle Academy. Practising typing skills on typing.com is always incredibly useful, as well as having open discussions with your children about E-Safety and how we keep ourselves safe online.
