English Mrs Webb	Take time to look at many different types of writing and poetry and what makes them different to one another, with a particular focus on historical fiction, recounts and poetry. Support the correct punctuation in all of their writing and encourage cursive handwriting and pride in their work in all of their homework.					
	Support your child's reading of class readers and personal reading and encourage quizzing and for them to meet their target, you can be involved at home through Home connect using the link on the letter sent home.

Mathematics Mrs Forth	Multiplication and division tables off by heart. Read and understand tables of data, information, price lists etc. Complete logic puzzles e.g. Sudoku or Kriss Kross. Typing is also a vital skill to practise; the website typing.com is a super resource for this and can be easily accessed from home. They could also experiment with photo and video editing software, such as Pic Collage or iMovie.

Mr Thackway	Geography: This term's focus is on mountainous environments – recall own experiences of places visited, look at family photographs of landscapes so personal opinions can be shared. Later in the term we will be debating sustainable energy options, a good opportunity to follow news stories on this topic
