Languages	French: Ask your child to teach you French words! During the first half-term, we will focus on

Sciences	Science: Talk to your child about how light behaves. How does it travel? Why does it reflect?

	electricity as an energy source. Highlight the dangers of mains electricity.						
	Computing: Your child can practise their programming skills at home by using the online						
Mr Adkins	programs used in class like Scratch. They could also experiment with 3-D drawing and						
	modelling with apps like Tinkercad.						
Humanities	<b>History:</b> We are studying Ancient Greece this term, please share myths, texts books or visit

	<b>RE:</b> This term's key question enables pupils to learn in depth from two different religions about
