Areas of the curriculum where you may be able to help your child this term.

English <i>Mr Webb</i>	Encourage your child to read aloud every day and enjoy shared reading together. Allow them times to choose their own books and to read them independently – sometimes recording their response in the reading journal. Continue to learn weekly spellings and praise your child for any writing they do at home. Have fun making up oral stories together.
Maths <i>Mr Webb</i>	Keep practising number bond to 10, 20 and 100. Learn 2x, 10x, 5x and 3x tables. Allow your child to choose items in shops, work out how much they cost and expected change. Have fun cooking, weighing and measuring together.
Languages <i>Senora Tourigny</i>	Spanish Please ask your child to sing the Spanish songs to you and ask them the words they have learned. This term we will be concentrating on body parts, naming rooms in the house, transport and the beach.
Science	Ask your child to identify any changes in materials at home and talk about how you know they are temporary or permanent changes. Observe growing plants and discuss what they need to survive. Plant some seeds in the garden and look for changes as we move through Spring and into Summer.
Technology <i>Mrs Emery</i>	ICT Discuss how we use electrical appliances at home e.g. the buttons we press on the microwave. Programming instructions.
Humanities <i>Mrs Monteith</i> <i>Mrs Stapleton</i> <i>Mrs Stapleton</i>	History Intrepid Explorers – Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. Nurses – Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell – see what can you find out about these people from books, internet and maybe museum visits. Geography We are learning all about Katie Morag and how living on a Scottish island is different from our own homes. R.E. Topics will include ‘Senses in Worship’ through Christian, Buddhist and Hindu traditions. Please be willing to discuss anything which might come from these lessons.
Performing and Creative Art <i>Mrs Byrne</i> <i>Mrs Barnes</i>	Creative Art and DT Colouring, cutting and sticking all help to improve fine motor skills. Look at the works of Monet, Van Gogh and Lowry. Talk to your child about food for different occasions. Encourage them to help you with safe food preparation and cooking at home Music Discuss with your child whether they would like to learn an instrument or have singing lessons in September.
