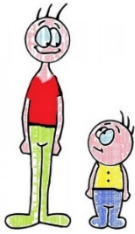


Reception Class Round-Up

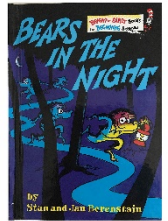


Some of the lovely things the children have been learning...



In maths we have been learning about simple capacity. We have been learning the terms 'full' 'half full' and 'empty.' We've enjoyed playing in the water and exploring which containers hold the most liquid. We've also been using non-standard units of measurement to investigate 'Who is the tallest in the class?'

Our work in literacy has been based around 'Bears in the Night' by Stan and Jan Barenstain.



We have been learning to use prepositions and written spooky spells. In handwriting we have been introduced to Georgia Pig's up and over letter family and practised forming cursive *o*.

Some of the things that the children will experience in the coming weeks...

We will be writing simple words and phrases to describe fireworks as we learn about Diwali and other festivals of light.

As part of our celebrations topic we will be writing party invitations and shopping lists. We will have the opportunity to make and write birthday cards in the party role play area.

In maths we will be reinforcing number formation of numerals 0-10. We will be securing counting with 1:1 correspondence and revisit ordering numbers up to 20.

- Practise sounds that have been introduced in class – see if they can be found in books you share
- Write birthday cards and invitations
- Practise lines for the nativity using a loud, clear voice
- Read stories online via 'Bug Club'
