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Dear Year 4 and 5 Parents

The Transition Meeting Thursday 1 March 2018

You will have noticed this event in the calendar for this term and I would like to give you a bit more information on the contents and purpose of this meeting as we get closer to the date.

The focus of the evening is to go through with you the potentially daunting process of finding the right school for your son or daughter when they leave us at the end of Year 6. You will, I am sure, have been thinking seriously about your choice of secondary school destinations for some time. I am also aware some of you may not be completely clear about how and when different things happen as part of this process, and the necessary procedures required for your child's applications to secondary schools. The transition meeting on 1 March will hopefully clarify the timeline involved in this and explain a bit more about how we can help you navigate the process without too much anxiety.

At the meeting you will be told about how and when to apply for maintained and independent secondary schools, the type of standardised scoring that the maintained schools use and there will be advice from members of staff on preparing your child for the exams they will be sitting. In June next term, parents of children in Year 5 will be invited in for consultations with Ms Forth and Ms Lowe to talk through the current state of play in terms of the progress of each child and specifically focus on the best options available. This discussion is very much about choosing the right school for your child, where they will flourish and their talents given a chance to develop and shine.

For now, you don't need to do anything other than continue to support your child's learning as best you can, and take any opportunity you get to visit the schools that you are considering. Attached to this letter is a timeline of what will happen over the next 12 months. I hope you find this useful.

sit the 11+ test
